

Key learning

1	Christians believe that Jesus Christ was resurrected.
2	Christians also believe in resurrection for all people after they die. This is based on the Gospels and on Saint Paul's writings in the New Testament.
3	The resurrection of Jesus is the Christian belief that he returned to life by a miracle. He died by crucifixion on Friday and rose from his tomb to new life on Sunday morning. This belief is celebrated at Easter.
4	The resurrection of Jesus Christ is written by the evangelists in the New Testament. They are the authors of the four Gospels in the New Testament - Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Christians believe that the resurrection is a central part of the Christian faith.
5	Christians believe that Jesus died on the cross to save mankind. When he was resurrected, Jesus defeated death. He is alive forever and sitting at God's right hand on a throne. This gives Christians the hope of a new life after death. This is because his resurrection mirrors the future for all Christians after they die.
6	Christians believe with Jesus Christ and with humans, the Bible shows that the resurrected body is changed from the original. This is because the human body, while alive is weak and frail but the resurrected person lives for ever,
7	Easter is the most significant holy day celebrated by Christians each year. This special day offers Christians the opportunity to reflect on God's fulfilment of His covenant through the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus
8	The Bible states that after His resurrection Jesus repeatedly appeared to His disciples over a period of 40 days. And then miraculously ascended into the presence of God.

Death and Resurrection of Jesus

1	Crucifixion	The Roman death penalty suffered by Jesus when he was raised to a cross
2	Gethsamene	The place where Jesus was arrested
3	Golgotha	The place where Jesus was crucified
4	Judas Iscariot	The disciple who betrayed Jesus
5	Last supper	The last meal Jesus ate with His disciples which included the Eucharist
6	Mary Magdalene	A woman who travelled with Jesus and His disciples and witnessed his death and resurrection
7	Sanhedrin	The supreme Jewish council which found Jesus guilty of blasphemy - words or actions that insult God
8	Pontus Pilate	The Roman governor who ordered the crucifixion of Jesus
9	Festival: Easter	Also called Resurrection Sunday is a Christian festival commemorating the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ
