School Uniform Reminder

It is recommended that every individual item of clothing and footwear is name-labelled so that lost items can be returned promptly.

Jewellery/Accessories (Rules here also apply on non-uniform days)

Earrings: one pair of discreet earrings may be worn (small plain studs only). Any pupil wearing pierced earrings must be able to remove them for P.E. and replace them themselves.
