### Year 5 Secondary Transition – Apply online for 2024 entry

If you live in Birmingham you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at <u>http://www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</u> between 1 September and 31 October 2023. It is important that you submit your application by 31 October 2023. Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2023 will be treated as late applications. Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, as these applications will be processed after 1 March 2024, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.

#### Walking to School – WOW – Living Streets



### <u>PE Kit</u>

Just a reminder about PE kit for the next academic year. Indoor P.E.	<ul> <li><u>Plain</u> white T-shirt</li> <li><u>Plain</u> black shorts or leggings or Cherry Orchard tracksuit bottoms</li> <li>Plain white, black or grey socks and black plimsolls (although children can be in bare feet for some activities)</li> </ul>
Outdoor Games	<ul> <li><u>Plain</u> white T-shirt</li> <li>For summer wear, <u>plain</u> black shorts or leggings</li> <li><u>Plain</u> white, black or grey socks and trainers</li> <li>Green school jumper OR Cherry Orchard tracksuit</li> </ul>
Swimming	<ul> <li>Swimming costume or trunks (modesty swimsuits may be worn if required)</li> <li>Swimming cap or bobble for tying back hair</li> <li>Towel</li> <li>Goggles if required</li> </ul>
