

- Try to eat healthily e.g. bring in water, fruit/vegetables for break times, and follow the school's healthy lunch box policy.

PARENT/CARER PROMISE

Parents/carers will:

Learning and the Curriculum

- Encourage and support their child with his/her learning and take advantage of opportunities e.g. information sessions and workshops provided at school for supporting learning at home.
- Encourage their child to complete homework tasks as outlined on Google Classroom and hand it in on time.
- Attend parents consultation sessions and discussions about their child's progress and support their child in meeting targets in order to accelerate their learning.
- Make the school aware of any concerns or problems that might affect their child's work, behaviour or wellbeing, including issues around online safety.
- Work with the school and encourage and promote outstanding attitudes to learning.
- Work with the school to develop their child's personal, social and emotional skills.
- Provide their child with the correct uniform and equipment for school and support him/her to bring everything he/she needs including their school planner and reading book.

Safeguarding Pupils

- Contact the school immediately if they have any concerns about the safety and welfare of any Cherry Orchard child.
- Never park on the crossing or zig-zag lines outside the school gates.
- Ensure that they keep the school informed of any of their child's medical conditions and outbreaks of head lice.
- Keep the school informed of any home time arrangements and ensure anyone collecting their child has the correct password.
- Keep the school informed of any change in contact details.
- Encourage their child to be healthy e.g. support our walk to school campaign and support healthy eating by only sending fruit or vegetables for mid-morning snack and following our Healthy Lunchbox Policy.

School Housekeeping

- Ensure their child attends school and do their utmost to avoid taking holidays in term time.
- Contact the school at the earliest opportunity (preferably by 9:30am) to inform of any absences.
- Ensure their child arrives at school on time: EYFS and KS1 between 8:50 and 9:00am; KS2 between 8:45 and 9:00am.
- Ensure their child is collected on time at 3:20pm in EYFS and KS1, and 3:25pm in KS2.
- Ensure that the school is kept informed of any changes of address, contact details, changes to end of day collection routines and medical appointments.
- Ensure that medication that has to be housed permanently in school e.g. Epipen, is kept up-to date.
- Complete information for school trips and events on time on ParentPay.
- Ensure that all items of school uniform are named and that any lost items will be reclaimed from lost property by the end of each term.
- Ensure their child's school lunches are booked one week in advance on ParentPay.
