# Year 6 Secondary Transition – Apply online for 2024 entry

If you live in Birmingham you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at <u>http://www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</u> between 1 September and 31 October 2023. It is important that you submit your application by 31 October 2023. Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2023 will be treated as late applications. Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, as these applications will be processed after 1 March 2024, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.

# Is my child too ill for school?



It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about <u>managing</u> <u>specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK</u>. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school on the first day. Let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know. #### What is the Family Hubs programme?

Family Hubs' is a central government project which aims to give children the best start in life. Is it designed to:

- improve access to services for all families, children and young adults in Birmingham that need support during children's journeys from 0 to 19 years (25 with SEND).
- improve connections between families, professional and service providers and to put relationships at the heart of family information, help and support.
- Be an effective a single 'front door', making it easier for families to get the help they need, and to improve the support on offer. This can include parenting support, support for home learning and early language development, parent and infant mental health and relationships and infant feeding advice.

#### Resources already available to families including:

- The Easy Peasy <u>App</u> to support children's speech, language and communication development
- The 50 Things App free App to help with home learning and language development
- First Words Together resources to help babies to talk



As children and young people prepare to return to school, we are sending a reminder of <u>FREE</u> <u>online courses</u> available to everyone in Birmingham to help to support with parenting.

There are **24 different online courses** in a variety of languages. The courses include:

- Understanding your child: from toddler to teenager
- Understanding your child with additional needs
- Understanding your child's mental health and well being
- Understanding your relationships

# **Physical Friday**


