MMR Guidance

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious. Please check that your child is up-to-date with their vaccinations.



The BBC's 500 Words Story Writing Competition

"Write a story you would love to read". BBC's 500 Words 2023 is the UK's largest children's writing competition for children aged 5-11. The deadline is Friday 10th November.



The BBC's 500 Words competition was launched in 2011 by BBC Radio 2 as a way to encourage young people to develop their writing skills and foster a love for storytelling. This year there are two age categories: 5-7 and 8-11.

To enter, children need to write an original story that they would want to read which is no more than 500 words. More information can be found here.

The Children's Commissioner for England has recently launched 'The Big Ambition' to hear directly from children, young people, and parents across the country.

This is an opportunity to hear from all children, in every part of the country and in every setting. The survey will be used to encourage policymakers to think about children and young people's needs, to ensure children's voices are reflected in the decisions that will affect them in years to come.

Parking reminder

Please can we remind parents who drive their children to and from school to leave themselves enough time to park considerately and legally.

It is illegal to <u>park</u>, <u>pull over or stop</u> on the zigzag lines, and anyone doing so may incur a fine. The zig-zags are there as a warning to motorists not to stop on this part of the road. This is because the cars block pedestrians' view of oncoming traffic, making crossing the road unnecessarily hazardous. Please note that school staff will always put keeping Cherry Orchard children safe above your parking needs, and we ask that parents are not aggressive towards us when they are reminded not to park on the zig-zags.

Also, the Highway Code Rule 243 reads, 'do not stop or park in front of an entrance to a property.' Please ensure that this rule is followed so that our neighbours can use their driveways at all times.

And to the vast majority of Cherry Orchard parents, thank you so much for parking legally and considerately every day, and for walking your children to school. Your sense of community and understanding is very much appreciated.

School Council traffic survey

On Tuesday 24th October, School Council conducted a traffic survey to find out how safe our pupils are when arriving at school. Their aim is to reduce the risk of a pupil getting hurt when coming to school. They are looking at how they can promote safer travel within the school. Here are their results:

Children getting out of the car on zig zag lines	35
Children not looking left or right or running across the zebra crossing	67
Children cycling to school and not wearing helmets	4
Cars pulling up onto the pavement or parking on the zig zags	16

As you can see, school council have a lot of work to do to help improve the safety of our pupils. Please help them by reinforcing these safety messages at home as well.

Control their bike: including setting off, cruising, slowing down, braking and stopping. They even

learnt to pedal one handed!

Pedal: without feeling wobbly or out of control

Be aware of their surroundings: looked behind and turned around obstacles.
