There have been cases of pupils with threadworm at school. Threadworms (pinworms) are tiny worms in your poo. They're common in children and spread easily. You can treat them without seeing a GP.


#### Year 2 - Pantomime

#### **Safeguarding Update**

A shocking number of dangerous baby products are making their way into family homes throughout the UK. A survey by the Institute reveals that 88% of health visitors have come across parents using dangerous products and 97% are concerned by the availability of dangerous products online. #### Measles

Measles is circulating in Birmingham and Solihull – protect yourselves and your families What to do if you think you or your child has measles?

It's vitally important any child displaying suspecting measles symptoms isolates at home with no contact with others. They should NOT go to hospitals, GP practices, pharmacies or any other health setting. Parents should call their GP who will take them through a screening process and if measles is suspected or identified, they will support them in a clinically safe way to ensure it is not transmitted to others.

#### What are the signs of measles?

The first signs of measles, which is a highly infectious condition that can cause serious illness and in rare cases be fatal, are:

- · High temperature;
- · Runny or blocked nose;
- · Sneezing;
- · Cough;
- · Red, sore, watery eyes;
- · A rash will usually appear a few days after cold-like symptoms (sometimes starts around the ears before spreading to the rest of the body).
