

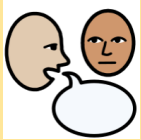


Writing Outcome 1:

To use their imagination to write about what is in their bucket

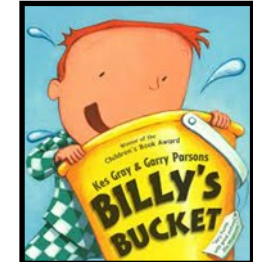
Purpose:

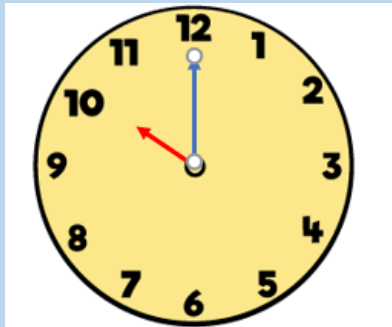
This half term, children will choose which books they would like to re read from their reading experiences in year 1.





Time

Children will learn how to tell the time to the o'clock and half past.



The minute hand is on the 12.
The hour hand is on the 10.
It is 10 o'clock.



The minute hand is on the 6.
The hour hand is just past the 8.
It is half past 8.

Children will solve problems such as 'what time will it be in an hour's time?'
They will also think about what units of time they would use to measure different activities e.g. brushing your teeth (minutes) or the school day (hours).

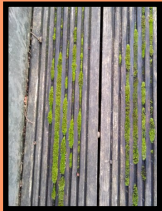

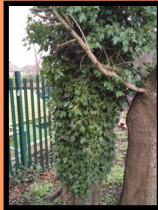
Plants

Children will know the names and appearance of at least 2 wild and 2 garden plants.

They will know that wild plants grow without the help of a human and that garden plants need to be planted by one.

Ivy



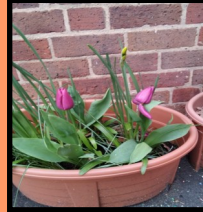

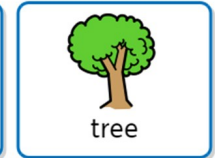
They will know names of deciduous and evergreen trees and will understand that deciduous trees lose their leaves in the winter whereas evergreen trees keep theirs all year round.

Children will know names of parts of flowering plants including trees.

Geography



Where should we go on holiday?

Children will learn about the weather and discuss how this changes throughout the year linked to the seasons. They will learn about the weather in the UK and compare this to another non-European country. Children will then visit Weston-Super-Mare to experience what a seaside holiday might feel like. They will explore the physical and human features of Weston.

Religious Education

Disposition: Being Curious and valuing knowledge

Disposition: Being Open, Honest and Truthful

Children will discuss how they find out things by asking questions. They will explore examples of holy scriptures and how these are a way of sharing information. They will then learn about a mezuzah which is a little box which Jewish people usually place a piece of parchment in with some words from the Torah. Finally, they will listen to the story of Jesus, as a boy, visiting the temple and asking lots of questions. In the second unit, children will listen to Aesop's Fable of the 'Boy who cried wolf' and the consequences of not telling the truth. Children will also listen to the story of King Mahendra's Successor from the Hindu tradition and discuss honesty and dishonesty.

Key questions:

- What helps them to find out about the world?
- How do Jewish people find out about God, and the world?
- How do Christians find out about God?
- Why does the truth matter? What is telling the truth?
- What did a character from the Hindu tradition learn about truth?

Programming animations

This unit introduces children to on-screen programming through Scratch Jr. Children will explore the way a project looks by investigating sprites and backgrounds. They will use programming blocks to use, modify, and create programs. Children will also be introduced to the early stages of program design through the introduction of algorithms.

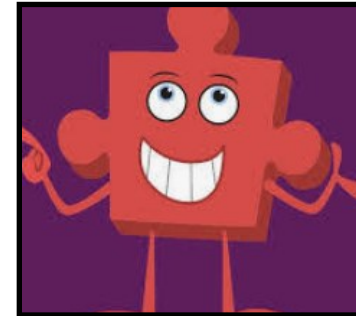

Jigsaw—Changing Me

Children will start to learn about the life cycles of animals and humans and they will understand that changes happen as we grow and this is ok. They will be able to describe some things that have changed and some things that have stayed the same. They will know how their body has changed since they were a baby and to be able to identify the main parts of the body that make boys different to girls and use the correct names for these. Finally children will be taught to respect their bodies and understand which parts are private.
