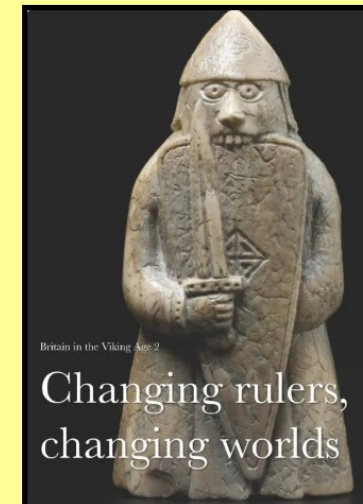
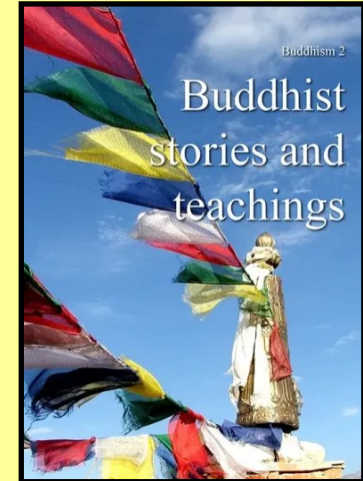


Guided reading

In guided reading sessions, children will be reading different text genres from the following book:



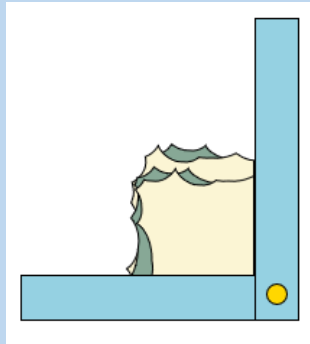
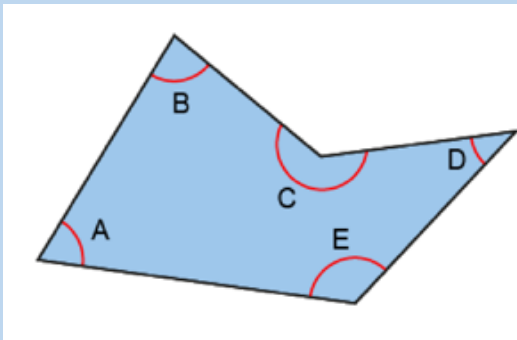

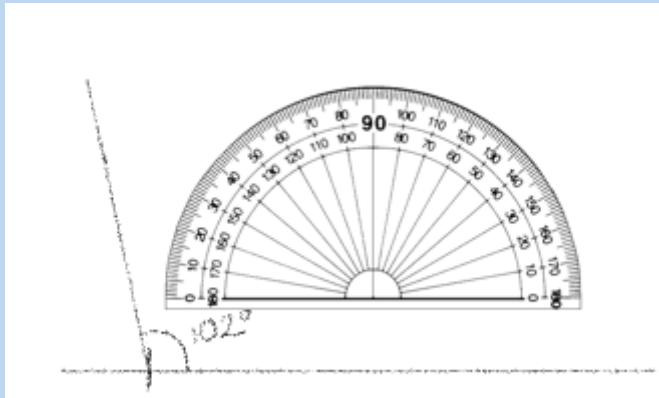


Angles

Children will use the terms acute (less than 90°), obtuse (greater than 90° and less than 180°) and reflex (greater than 180°) when describing the size of angles. They will also be able to identify right angles.



Children will know that the unit of measurement for angles is called degrees. They will estimate the size of angles and then measure these using a protractor.

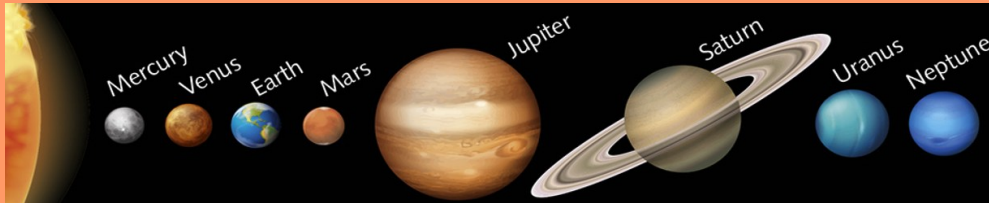

These planets orbit the sun.

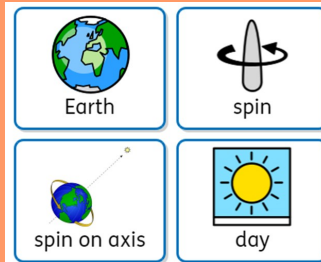
The moon orbits the Earth.

The sun rises in the East and sets in the West. It looks like the sun moves across the sky because the Earth is orbiting the sun.

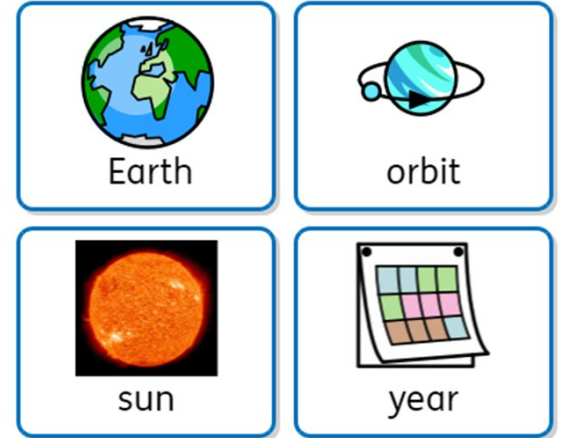
It is not safe to look directly at the sun.

Geography



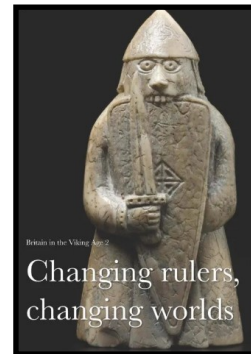
In this topic, children will learn about the following:

History



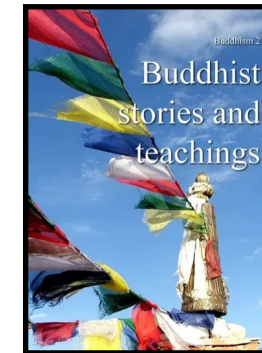
In this topic, the children will learn about the following:

- Buddhism today in the UK, India, Tibet.

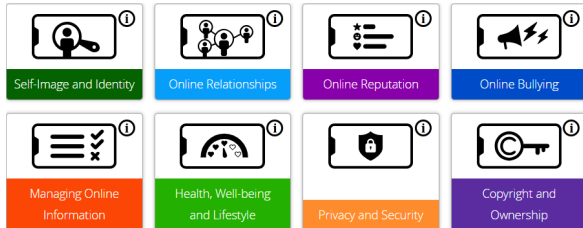

Online Safety

Children will be taught to recognise that online bullying can be different to bullying in the physical world and will be able to describe some of these differences. They will be able to explain how anyone can get help if they are being bullied online and identify when to tell a trusted adult. Children will explore online reputations and will describe that information about anyone online can be used by others to make judgments about an individual and why these may be incorrect. Finally, children will describe how fake news may affect someone's emotions and behaviour and explain why this may be harmful.

Children will begin by looking at different products that use rotating parts. They will investigate how motors can be attached to these moving parts. Children will then apply their research to design, make and then evaluate their own fairground ride which has a rotating part.

PSHE

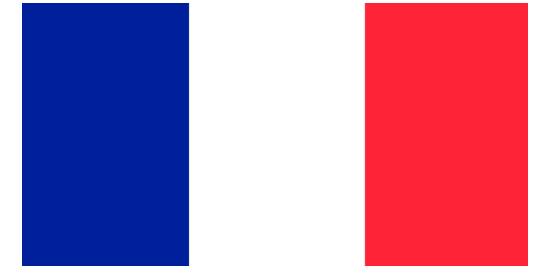
