

## Sports Premium Strategy 2019-20

The PE and Sports Premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport.

What percentage of year 6 pupils can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	44% - This is a lower percentage than normal (due to COVID-19) as we would normally have had top-up lessons in the summer term to boost and support learning and attainment.
What percentage of year 6 pupils can use a range of strokes effectively?	16% - This is a lower percentage than normal (due to COVID-19) as we would normally have had top-up lessons in the summer term to boost and support learning and attainment.
What percentage of year 6 pupils can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	0% - This is usually taught in year 6 top-up lessons which did not go ahead due to COVID-19.
Has Cherry Orchard used additional Sports Premium funds to provide additional swimming provision <b>over and above</b> the National Curriculum requirements?	The intention was to use additional Sports Premium funds to provide additional swimming provision but due to COVID-19, this was not possible.
