Aims of Pupil Premium Spending for Cherry Orchard Primary School

- To provide additional support for pupils
- To facilitate smaller group work and 1:1 work in Literacy and Mathematics across the school.
- To provide interventions to accelerate progress in maths, reading and writing.
- To provide additional resources for interventions to accelerate progress in reading.
- To improve the attainment and progress of disadvantaged pupils exceeding at KS1.
- To subsidise educational trips.
- To support pupils learning at home.
- To provide pastoral support for pupils.
- To supplement school uniform costs.
- To provide out of hours clubs and give children additional learning opportunities such as music tuition.

Barriers to future attainment

- The barriers and challenges disadvantaged pupils face at Cherry Orchard are varied – there is no single difficulty faced by all.
- Pupils eligible for PP attain lower than other pupils in school and nationally in Year 2 in maths, reading and writing – data from Year 1 17-18.
- Pupils eligible for PP in Year 5 make less progress than other pupils in school for reading – data from 17-18.
- Pupils eligible for PP attain lower than other pupils in school and nationally in Year 6 in maths and writing – data from Year 6 17-18.
- Emotional and behavioural issues for some pupils who are eligible.
- Amount of pupils eligible for PP attending extra-curricular activities.
